

prof. dr hab. SŁAWOMIR KRZYSZTOF JUSZCZYK



Graduate of agricultural economics from the Warsaw University of Life Sciences (SGGW) and of banking management from the Warsaw School of Economics. He earned his doctorate in 1995, his habilitation in 2006, and the position of associate professor in 2010. In 2014, he received the title of professor of economics from the President of the Republic of Poland, and four years later, he became a full professor.

His research focuses on agricultural economics, agribusiness finance, and commercial and cooperative banking. He is the author or co-author of approximately 250 publications, including 23 books. To date, he has lectured on agricultural economics, corporate finance, financial policy, banking (in Polish and English), credit institution management, risk management, and more. He was the head of the postgraduate studies “Cooperative Bank Management” and the full-time doctoral studies.

He has collaborated with local government, government, cooperative, and corporate administration, banks, and the European Parliament, and has also served as a consultant to the FAO. He completed internships abroad in the USA, where he collaborated with the University of Arkansas on bank lending to farms and small and medium-sized enterprises in rural areas. He also completed a research internship in Finland, where he lectured and consulted for doctoral students at the University of Vaasa and dealt with matters related to research financing and innovation in the economy.

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He has supervised nine doctoral dissertations to date, and more are in preparation under his academic supervision. He also supervised over 200 master's and bachelor's theses, served as a reviewer for doctoral and postdoctoral dissertations, and served as Chairman of the Committee for the Award of the Academic Title of Professor.

He was a mentor to several generations of students and a friend to PhD students and academics.

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
